PROFILE

The Nigerian Institute of Social and Economic Research (NISER) is a leading policy research institute in Nigeria. Its history dates back to 1950 when the West African Institute for Social and Economic Research (WAISER) was set up to provide information on issues of vital importance to the development of the British Colonies then in West Africa.

The disintegration of WAISER started with the political independence of the Gold Coast (now Ghana) in 1957. When WAISER was formally dissolved in 1960, the Nigerian Institute of Social and Economic Research was established as a national research institution and located at the campus of the University of Ibadan. NISER's main source of funding is the Federal Government of Nigeria.

NISER is now housed in its own campus at Ojoo, along Oyo Road, Ibadan. Development work is still going on at the new campus. It is envisaged that the development will be completed in the near future. NISER Annexe is still on the University of Ibadan Campus.

The objectives of the Institute, as stated originally in NISER Decree of 1977 and later in the "Nigerian Institute of Social and Economic Research Act" 1990 are:

- (a) to provide consultancy services to the federal and state governments, their agencies and organisations, in the field of economic and social development;
- (b) to conduct research into the economic and social problems of the country with a view to applying the results thereof;
- (c) to organise seminars and conferences on problems of economic and social development in the country, whether on its own accounts or on behalf of the government of Nigeria or their agencies; and
- (d) to cooperate with Nigerian universities, research institutes and other institutions in the mobilisation of the country's research potential for the task of national development and dissemination of research findings for the use of policy makers at all levels.

AN OVERVIEW OF RESEARCH ACTIVITIES IN 2000

In line with the cardinal objective, which informed the setting up of the Institute, research endeavours as in the past, remained the central focus of the Institute's activities in the year 2000. Thus, in pursuance of the primary research mandate of NISER to conduct research into the economic and social problems of the country and provide consultancy services to various tiers of government, public agencies and work in collaboration with other research institutes and universities, the research activities in the year covered various aspects of the country's socio-economic life.

Structurally, the research based endeavours during the year under review were categorised into Individual Research Projects (IRPs), Team Research Projects (TRPs) and publications of research outputs such as monographs and books. Specifically, twelve (12) IRPs were duly completed, eighteen (18) new proposals were approved and funded and thirty-seven (37) were ongoing in the year 2000. In addition, nineteen (19) policy oriented research studies results were published. Fifteen (15) of these publications were monographs while four (4) were books. The essence of these scholarly publications is to enhance the widespread dissemination of research outputs for the benefits of the general public and government in particular as statutorily required of the Institute.

By disaggregation of the research endeavours according to departments, five (5) completed IRPs emanated from Agriculture and Rural Development Department (ARDD); Business and Technology Development Department (BTDD) produced one (1); Economic Development Department (EDD) also recorded one (1); Physical Development Department (PDD) turned out two (2) and Social Development Department (SDD) contributed three (3). Further, of the thirty-eight (38) ongoing IRPs, 5,5,10, 6,4, 3,1 and 4 respectively were recorded by ARDD, BTDD, EDD, HRDD, PDD, PDU, Legal and Special Duties Department and SDD.

In the year 2000, the principal team- research based programme the NISER Annual Monitoring Research Programme (NAMRP), witnessed publications of some previous scholarly field reports. Some others which have reached advanced stages as research work on them have been duly completed were being processed and discussed at in-house seminars to get them ready for publication. Each research department now publishes its NAMRP report after due processes of survey, research-oriented analysis and rigorous seminars to subject the reports to scholarly discourse. The priority accorded research activities was also manifested in twenty (20) publications turned out during the year under review. Of particular interest in these publications is the title “Strategic Issues in a Globalising and Liberalising World”, co-authored by Prof. Olu Ajakaiye and Engineer Bayo Akinbinu.

Further, in consonance with fulfilling one of its pertinent mandates, the Institute was engaged in collaborative research activities with other Federal Government agencies. Of particular interest is the collaborative study undertaken in association with Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) and Federal Office of Statistics (FOS), on “Nigeria’s Informal Manufacturing Enterprises”, domiciled in Macro-economic and Strategic Modelling Unit (MASMU), which is a continuous exercise. Also, the Institute collaborated with the National Planning Commission in simulating the CGE and Econometric Models which provided input into macroeconomic framework for National Rolling Plan, 2000 - 2002 and the 2001 Federal Budget.

A number of conferences were held during the year. These include: from **Business and Technology Development**, (I) “Promoting S & T in a Democratic Environment”, (ii) “African Technology Policy (ATPS) Annual Workshop”, and (iii) “Technology Policy Seminar”; from **Physical Development**, (I) “NISER Seminar on “Presidential Policy Issues”, (ii) “National Training Workshop on Contemporary Issues in Human Settlements Development in Nigeria”, and (iii) NISER Seminar on NISER’s Review of Nigerian Development; from **Political Development Unit**, (i) Writers’ Workshop on “*Sustainable Democracy in Nigeria*”; from **MASMU**, (i) “Methodological Seminar on NISER Review of Nigerian Development (NRND)”, (ii) Workshop on NISER Review of Nigerian Development (NRND), (iii) In-house Seminar on NISER Review of Nigerian Development (NRND)”, and (iv) NISER Review of Nigerian Development (NRND) Seminar on *The Role of the State*; from **Research and Consultancy Unit**, (I) Legislative

Strengthening Attachment Project Orientation/Training Workshop.
(ii)Legislative Strengthening Attachment Project Evaluation Workshop.

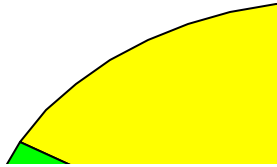

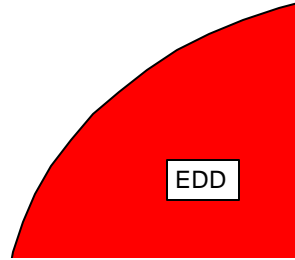
